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Summary of Actions Taken by the Board on March 22, 2016

Mr. Nelson led recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS

Mr. Thornton gave kudos to Mr. Vithoulkas and the County administration for helping brand the community by placing two new "Welcome to Henrico County" signs in the Laburnum Avenue and Airport Drive corridors. Mr. Nelson concurred with Mr. Thornton's remarks.

Mr. Nelson commented on the large number of Boy Scouts in the audience and recognized Cari Tretina, a Management Specialist with the County Manager's Office and the host of more than 30 Boy Scouts participating in the County's new Local Government 101 Student and Scout Educational Program.
