The Henrico County Board of Supervisors convened a regular meeting on Tuesday, June 27, 2017, at 7:00 p.m. in the Board Room, Administration Building, Henrico County Government Center, Parham and Hungary Spring Roads, Henrico County, Virginia.

Mrs. O'Bannon led recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

Reverend Marcus D. Martin, Pastor of New Bridge Baptist Church, delivered the invocation.

Mrs. O'Bannon explained she abstained from voting on the minutes because she was attending the Douglas Freeman High School graduation on June 13 and unable to make the Board meetings.

#### MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Henrico County's departments and agencies have earned 28 Achievement Awards from the National Association of Counties (NACo) for groundbreaking programs, two of which were also recognized in the new 100 Brilliant Ideas at Work category. The County received an Achievement Award and a 100 Brilliant Ideas at Work honor for an initiative from Mrs. O'Bannon that allows residents to watch and participate in virtual town hall meetings via a live stream on the internet. The County's library system, directed by Jerry McKenna, collected both an Achievement Award and a 100 Brilliant Ideas at Work honor for a program that gives young library patrons an intuitive way to find books of interest by subject matter in the children's section and by emotion and mood in the teen section. Henrico's 28 awards, which were developed and implemented by nine general government departments as well as the public schools, are the most of any county in Virginia for the 12th consecutive year and are the seventh most nationally. Mr. Thornton will formally accept the awards next month in Columbus, Ohio, during NACo's 2017 Annual Conference. NACo's annual awards program gives the County an opportunity to gauge how well it innovates and adapts to the needs of the community. Mr. Vithoulkas congratulated the members of staff who participated in the awards on their ingenuity and expressed appreciation to the Board for providing the necessary resources to earn these awards. Mrs. O'Bannon credited Cari Tretina, a former Management Specialist in the County Manager's Office, for making the virtual town hall meetings happen.

On the evening of June 16, more than 3½ inches of rain were gauged in the Lakeside area in a two-hour period. The storm caused significant local flooding, and Galaxie Road, north of Lafayette Avenue and south of Alycia Avenue, was overwhelmed by the volume of rainfall. Steve Yob, Director of Public Works, showed several photographs depicting the Galaxie Road washout and the response by his department's crews to the undermined area of the road, where significant damage and two vehicular accidents occurred. The crews saved the road from further damage and put up safety barricades. Restoration of the road is expected to take four to seven weeks. Mr. Vithoulkas pointed out that Deputy County Manager Tim Foster, Mr. Yob, and the Department of Public Works were on the scene overnight after the storm. He acknowledged and expressed appreciation for their efforts.

#### **BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS**

Mr. Hinson announced that Dick Glover, who formerly represented the Brookland District on the Board of Supervisors, has been selected for posthumous induction into the Babe Ruth Southeast Region Hall of Fame. A ceremony and presentation honoring Mr. Glover will be held when the Babe Ruth World Series returns to Henrico County in August.

#### PUBLIC COMMENTS

Paul Speidell, a resident of the Brookland District and President of the Richmond Lions Youth Rugby Club, spoke to the growth of rugby in Henrico and expressed appreciation for his organization's partnership with the County. He noted the Richmond Lions use facilities at the J. Sergeant Reynolds Community College Parham Road Campus, Dorey Park, and Pouncey Tract Park. Mr. Speidell introduced Stuart Willis, President of Rugby Virginia, who invited the Board to a mid-Atlantic rugby tournament that will be hosted by the Richmond Lions on July 8 at Dorey Park. Mr. Speidell presented the Board with a rugby ball containing the Richmond Lions logo.

Bruce Richardson, a local realtor and resident of the Fairfield District, reviewed the benefits of a Virginia Housing Development Authority homebuyer education course that is offered free of charge to the public in the Richmond area. He suggested residents of Essex Village should be encouraged to look at homeownership as an option to renting.

Mr. Branin pointed out the Virginia General Assembly has granted localities the ability as of July 1 to adopt ordinances regulating Airbnb rentals. He asked for the Board's support in requesting staff to develop a white paper laying out this issue. Mr. Rapisarda commented on the legislation and noted that localities may enact zoning regulations for Airbnb rentals and make them subject to a lodging tax. He explained the Planning Commission would have to act on any changes to the zoning ordinance. Mr. Vithoulkas advised that staff will bring a white paper forward to the Board. Mr. Branin asked that

staff expedite this process because these rentals have adversely affected the quality of life in a couple of Henrico neighborhoods.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:26 p.m.

WHEREAS, the Virginia General Assembly created the Richmond Metropolitan Transportation Authority (the "Authority" and formerly known as the Richmond Metropolitan Authority) in 1966 pursuant to Chapter 178, Acts of the Virginia General Assembly (as amended and in effect from time to time, and as currently codified in Title 33.2, Chapter 29, Code of Virginia, the "Enabling Act") for the purpose of, among other things, owning and operating limited access highways within its member jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, the Authority currently owns and operates the Powhite Parkway, the Downtown Expressway and the Boulevard Bridge (the "Expressway System") and has financed and refinanced a portion of the capital needs of the Expressway System with borrowings in the private and public debt markets; and

WHEREAS, as amended in 2014, the Enabling Act requires the approval of the Mayor and the Council of the City of Richmond and the Boards of Supervisors of the Counties of Henrico and Chesterfield in order for the Authority to borrow money and issue bonds, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness; and

WHEREAS, the Authority in 2011 issued its \$23,225,000 Taxable Expressway Revenue and Refunding Bond, Series 2011-A (the "2011-A RMTA Bond"), in order to refund certain of its outstanding indebtedness and to finance, among other things, (i) the construction and equipping of open road tolling lanes on the Downtown Expressway, (ii) the addition of express lanes and improvements to the existing toll plaza building, (iii) the replacement/refurbishment of toll collection equipment, and (iv) road surface overlays; and

WHEREAS, the Authority can realize debt service savings through the issuance of refunding bonds in order to refund the 2011-A RMTA Bond in advance of its stated maturity; and

WHEREAS, the Authority's Board has approved the issuance of its Taxable Expressway Revenue Refunding Bond (the "RMTA Refunding Bond") in order to refund the 2011-A RMTA Bond and to pay costs of issuance of the transaction, subject to obtaining the approvals of the Mayor and the member jurisdictions as required by the Enabling Act, and has requested that the Mayor and the jurisdictions provide such approvals; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of Henrico County (the "County") to approve the Authority's issuance of the RMTA Refunding Bond.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Henrico County, Virginia, that:

- 1. The Board hereby approves the Authority's issuance of the RMTA Refunding Bond, as and to the extent required by the Enabling Act, for the purpose of refunding all or a portion of the 2011-A RMTA Bond and paying costs of issuance. The RMTA Refunding Bond may be issued in one or more series of different principal amounts and interest rates, with the timing, amounts and number of series dependent on the Authority's need for funds and market conditions; provided, however, that in no event shall the RMTA Refunding Bond mature later than July 15, 2041.
- 2. The County's approval of the Authority's issuance of the RMTA Refunding Bond does not constitute an endorsement to prospective purchasers of such obligation of the creditworthiness of the Authority. The RMTA Refunding Bond shall not be deemed to constitute a debt of the Commonwealth of Virginia, the County, or of any other political subdivision thereof except the Authority. Neither the Commonwealth of Virginia, the County nor any other political subdivision thereof, except the Authority, shall be obligated to pay the principal of, redemption premium or late charges, if any, or interest on the RMTA Refunding Bond or other costs or amounts incident thereto. Neither the faith and credit nor the taxing power of the Commonwealth of Virginia or any political subdivision thereof, including the County and the Authority, is pledged to the payment of the principal of, redemption premium or late charges, if any, or interest on the RMTA Refunding Bond or other costs or amounts incident thereto. The RMTA Refunding Bond shall not constitute an indebtedness within the meaning of any debt limitation or restriction.
- 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption, and shall continue in full force and effect until June 30, 2018, unless extended by subsequent action of the Board.



WHEREAS, Section 46.2-878.2 of the Code of Virginia provides for the imposition of a \$200 fine for speeding, in addition to other penalties provided by law, when a locality has established a maximum speed limit for a highway in a residence district and the speed limit is indicated by appropriately placed signs; and,

WHEREAS, because Henrico County maintains its own roads, the statute also requires the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") to develop criteria for the overall applicability for the installation of the signs and to request the application of the statute to certain residential streets in the County before the additional fine may be imposed; and.

WHEREAS, the Board approved detailed criteria (the "Criteria") for the County's Traffic Calming Program on February 10, 2004; and,
