The Henrico County Board of Supervisors convened a regular meeting on Tuesday, September 26, 2017, at 7:00 p.m. in the Board Room, Administration Building, Henrico County Government Center, Parham and Hungary Spring Roads, Henrico County, Virginia.

Mrs. O'Bannon called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Reverend Adam Sowder, Lead Pastor of Discovery United Methodist Church, delivered the invocation.

On motion of Mr. Nelson, seconded by Branin, the Board approved the minutes of the September 12, 2017, Regular and Special Meetings.

#### **MANAGER'S COMMENTS**

Mr. Vithoulkas saluted Communications Officer Kristin Willis, Lt. Richard Cosby, and Officers Allen Kemp, Jonathan Brummitt, and Enrique Santana for representing the Police Division and the County in the "Henrico Way" and for following their training and making the County proud of the outcome in an incident involving the shooting of a Virginia state trooper. He also recognized Chief Hum Cardounel and Capt. Mark Banks of the Henrico Police Division and Richmond Police Sergeant Jonathan Nathanson.

#### **BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS**

Mr. Hinson noted the recent passing of Edwin "Buddy" Ragsdale, who began his career as a Henrico County police officer and later represented the Varina District for two terms on the Board of Supervisors. He was instrumental in bringing the first public library to Henrico and having Laburnum Avenue widened to four lanes and extended into the Varina District. Mr. Ragsdale was chairman of the Board of Supervisors in 1971 and served several terms in the Virginia House of Delegates. Mr. Hinson characterized Mr. Ragsdale as a person who had a vision and got the job done.

Mr. Branin pointed out the Federal Emergency Management Agency has 28 Urban Search and Rescue teams throughout the United States, two of which are in Virginia. Many members of Virginia Task Force 2 are employed by Henrico County's Division of Fire. Virginia Task Force 2 was recently dispatched to Texas and twice to Puerto Rico. At Mr. Branin's request, Fire Chief Tony McDowell provided an update on the task force and these deployments. Henrico is the only locality outside of Hampton Roads that has participation on Virginia Task Force 2, which is based in Virginia Beach. Five Henrico firefighters who are members of this task force were deployed to Puerto Rico for Hurricane Maria. They had a significant impact on American interests and citizens in Puerto Rico. Mr. Branin noted Henrico County participates on a global scale whenever there is a national or international emergency. He asked Chief McDowell to pass along the Board's thanks to the division's task force members as well as the Board's congratulations on their safe return home.

#### **PRESENTATIONS**

Mr. Thornton presented a proclamation recognizing October 2-6, 2017, as Customer Service Week. Accepting the proclamation was Rebecca Slough, Senior Human Resources Analyst. Joining her was Paula Reid, Director of Human Resources.

Mrs. O'Bannon presented a proclamation recognizing October 8 – 14, 2017, as Fire Prevention Week. Accepting the proclamation was Henry Rosenbaum, Battalion Chief and Fire Marshal. Joining him was Chief McDowell.

#### **PUBLIC HEARING ITEMS**

Resolution – Amendments to the FY 2017-18 Annual Fiscal Plan to (1)

Mr. Nelson advised Mrs. O'Bannon that questions he raised at the last Board meeting pertaining to funding for school instructional positions were answered in a letter sent by the Superintendent of Schools to the County Manager.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this item.

On motion of Mr. Hinson, seconded by Mr. Thornton, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item – see attached resolution.

Mr. Vithoulkas introduced Chris Sorensen, the school system's new Assistant Superintendent for Finance and Administration. Mr. Vithoulkas noted Mr. Sorensen has worked with several localities and has a great amount of experience. Mr. Sorensen offered a brief overview of his professional background. Immediately prior to joining Henrico County Public Schools, he served for two and a half years as the chief financial officer for Chesterfield County Public Schools.

Steve Price, Director of Real Property, showed a vicinity map of the subject site.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this item.

On motion of Mr. Thornton, seconded by Mr. Hinson, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item – see attached resolution.

#### PUBLIC COMMENTS

Vladimir Gurshpun, a resident of the Three Chopt District, requested that the Department of Public Works conduct a speed limit study on Lauderdale Drive. He expressed concern the section of the road between Gayton Road and Ridgefield Parkway has become a police speed trap and the road's 35-miles-per-hour speed limit is too low. Mrs. O'Bannon explained that the County's Traffic Engineer has the responsibility for setting speed limits based on warrants. Steve Yob, Director of Public Works, pointed out the last speed study on Lauderdale Drive was conducted in 2013 and that he cannot recommend raising the speed limit on this section of Lauderdale Drive. Mr. Branin remarked that although he does not feel the speed needs to be increased he will consider asking for an additional speed study.

David Daughtry, a representative of Sports Backers and Three Chopt District resident, expressed support for more sidewalks and better road lighting to allow residents greater opportunity to walk for fitness. Mrs. O'Bannon informed Mr. Daughtry that the County's Department of Public Relations & Media Services is producing a program for its cable television station, HCTV, regarding pedestrian safety. Tamra McKinney, the department's director, noted the program will air in the spring of 2018. Mr. Branin advised Mr. Daughtry of sidewalk construction projects that are planned for the area of the County where Mr. Daughtry lives.

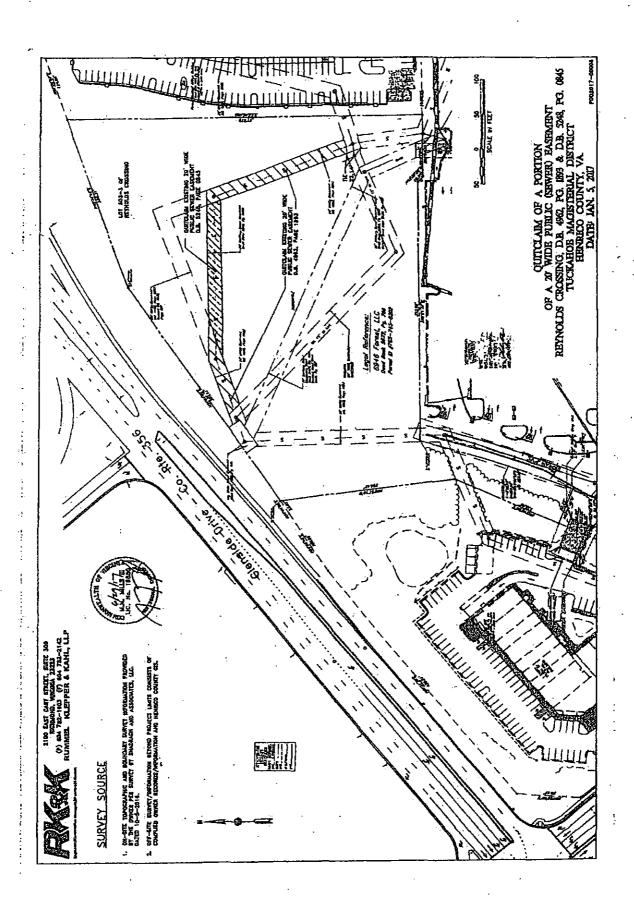

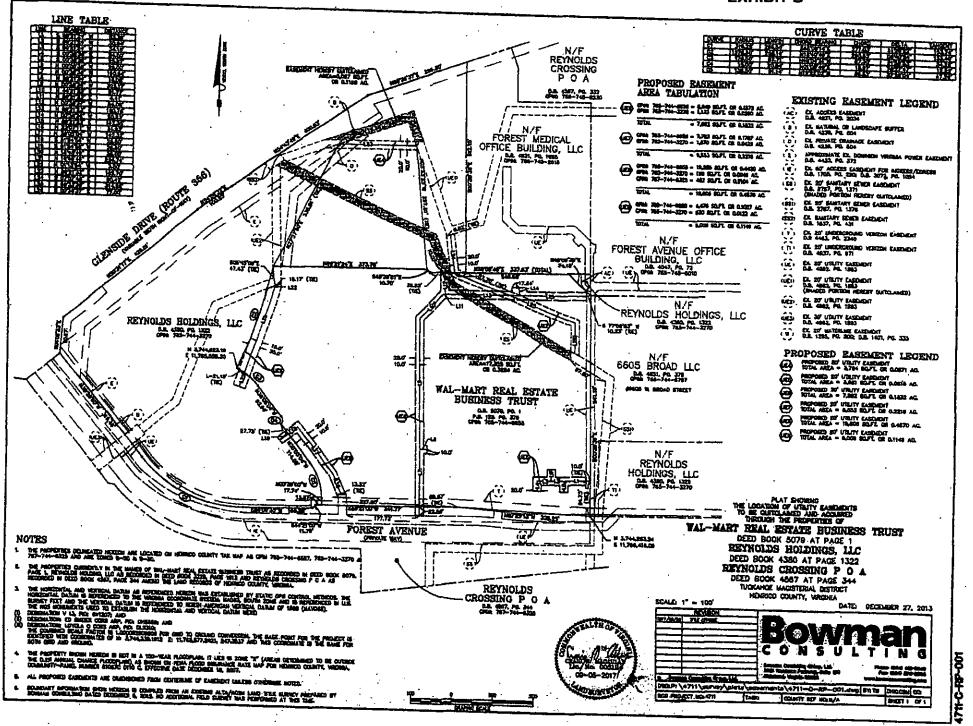

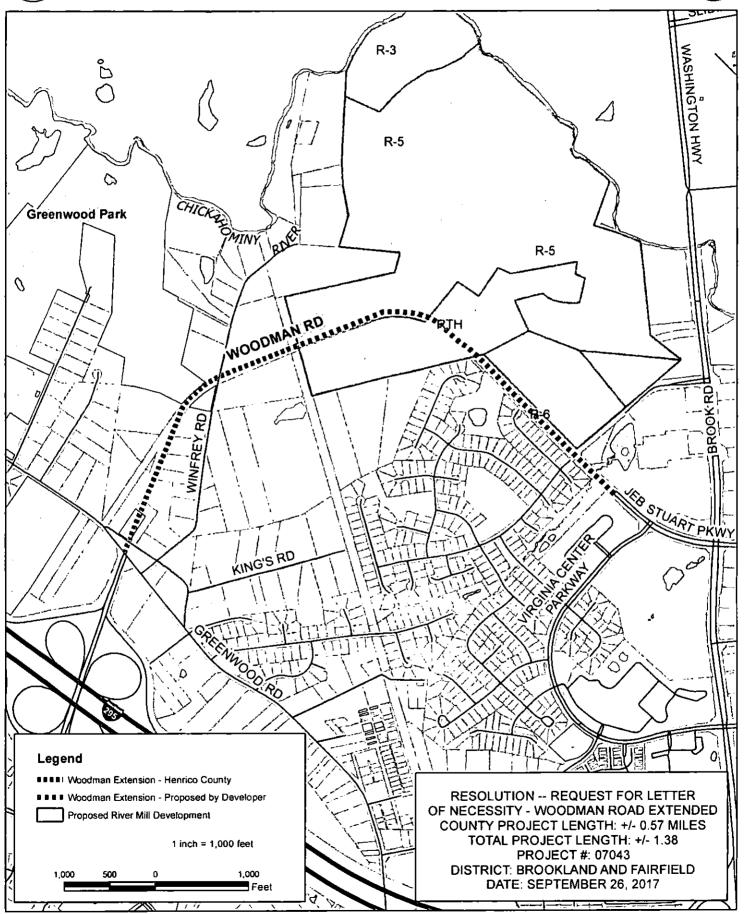
