The Henrico County Board of Supervisors convened a regular meeting on Tuesday, May 26, 2020, at 7:00 p.m. in the Board Room, Administration Building, Henrico County Government Center, Parham and Hungary Spring Roads, Henrico County, Virginia.

Mr. Branin called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m. and led the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Nelson delivered the invocation.

Mr. Branin reminded residents that they could participate in the meeting remotely during public hearings or the public comment period. He noted directions were posted on the home page of the County's website and on the video screen in the Board Room and then reviewed the directions for those residents wishing to participate.

On motion of Mr. Thornton, seconded by Mrs. O'Bannon, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved the May 12, 2020, Regular Meeting Minutes.

MANAGER'S COMMENTS

There were no comments from the Manager.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS

Mr. Nelson thanked Mr. Vithoulkas, County staff, and the more than 200 volunteers who came together on May 23 at Henrico High School and walked to communities in eastern and central Henrico. The group distributed reusable personal protective equipment (PPE) and census information to more than 10,000 homes. Mr. Nelson remarked that this extraordinary event for which the County was responsible warmed his heart by ensuring residents have what they need to protect themselves and others. He expressed excitement that the volunteer effort will be repeated this coming weekend in western Henrico and noted that many citizens demonstrated their gratitude for the May 23 event by posting favorable comments on his Facebook and Twitter pages. Mr. Vithoulkas thanked the County's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) for coordinating these two events and one previous event. He asked citizens who are interested in volunteering for the upcoming event to email him or their district representative on the Board. Mr. Nelson pointed out the Governor announced earlier in the day that citizens in private establishments or public areas will be required to wear face masks beginning May 29. Mrs. O'Bannon advised that this requirement will be enforced by the Virginia Department of Health (VDH). Mr. Branin extended kudos to the EOC and Mr. Vithoulkas for making sure Henrico citizens are getting the PPE they need.

Mrs. O'Bannon invited the public to join her for a virtual town hall meeting that she will host on May 28 at 1:00 p.m. The meeting will be aired on You Tube, where citizens will have the opportunity to ask questions. Neil Luther, Director of Recreation and Parks, will discuss summer camps for children.

RECOGNITION OF NEWS MEDIA

No media representatives were present.

ADDED BY UNANIMOUS CONSENT

Mr. Vithoulkas pointed out that Randall R. "Randy" Silber, Deputy County Manager for Community Development, has enjoyed a 43-year career in local government, including nearly 35 years with Henrico County. Mr. Silber announced his retirement, effective June 19, and was attending his final Board meeting. Mr. Vithoulkas recommended the Board add the following resolution to the general agenda by unanimous consent that expresses the Board's appreciation to Mr. Silber for his service.

On motion of Mr. Schmitt, seconded by Mr. Nelson, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved adding to the agenda an item numbered 137-20 and titled "Resolution - Expressing Appreciation to Randall R. Silber" - see attached resolution.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Thornton, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item – see attached resolution.

Mr. Branin presented the resolution to Mr. Silber in recognition of Mr. Silber's superior service, skilled leadership, and substantial contributions. Mr. Silber's wife, Lisa, was in attendance for the presentation. The following members of Mr. Silber's family were listening to the presentation

online: his children, Ryan Silber and Lindsay Vidler; his stepchildren, Thomas Ware and Anna Lee Ware; and his brother and sister, Greg Silber and Deborah Insel. Mr. Silber expressed appreciation to the Board and Mr. Vithoulkas for the surprise resolution and commented that he was honored, touched, and humbled. He reflected on his career, cited several mentors in the Planning Department who challenged him along the way, and noted he is indebted to the three incredible and visionary Henrico County Managers for whom he has had an opportunity to work. Mr. Silber credited his exceptional and skilled agency directors and agency staff for his success and accomplishments. He remarked that his longevity with the County has been grounded in the stability and continuity of the Board of Supervisors, who through their solid governance have created a balanced, sustainable, diverse, and quality community. Mr. Silber spoke to his passion for his career in planning and local government but pointed out he is looking forward to retirement and the next chapter.

Mr. Thornton extended metaphorical flowers to Mr. Silber and complimented him for practicing diversity and showing civility, professionalism, passion, and panache. Mr. Thornton stated he was thankful for meeting a person like Mr. Silber after first coming on the Board.

PUBLIC HEARING ITEM

Mr. Branin reiterated the announcement he made at the beginning of the meeting pertaining to remote participation by residents during the public hearing and public comment portions of the meeting.

Ordinance - To Amend and Reordain Section 9-2 of the Code of the County of Henrico Titled "Precincts and polling places" by Temporarily Changing the Polling Places for Certain Precincts Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

Mr. Vithoulkas responded to a question from Mr. Nelson and confirmed for Mr. Branin that this change is only for the June 23 primary election and voters will be notified twice by mail of the change.

No one from the public spoke in opposition to this item.

On motion of Mrs. O'Bannon, seconded by Mr. Nelson, and by unanimous vote, the Board approved this item - see attached ordinance.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Edward Lee, a resident of the Fairfield District, requested that the Board call for a delay in reopening the County considering current COVID-19 statistics reported by VDH and the City of Richmond's recent decision to delay its reopening. Mr. Nelson responded to Mr. Lee's concerns. He noted the City of Richmond is moving into phase one reopening on May 29 and only 16 of the 118 COVID-19-related deaths in Henrico were in the general population as opposed to nursing homes. Mr. Nelson also pointed out only 13.2 percent of

Henrico's population has tested positive for COVID-19 versus 24.1 percent of those tested in the City of Richmond and the number of cases in Henrico has stabilized. He expressed comfort with the County's adherence to the Commonwealth's phase one reopening plan.

Mr. Schmitt asked Mr. Yob to provide him with updates as the County goes forward with inspections and acceptance of the roads included in this resolution.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

1. That Section 9-2 of the Code of the County of Henrico be amended and reordained as follows:

Sec. 9-2. Precincts and polling places.

s. Oakview Precinct. 
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
- 2. That the remaining provisions of Section 9-2 of the Code of the County of Henrico will remain unchanged and in full force and effect.




