#### MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Mr. Vithoulkas recognized Jamie Massey, Keith White, and Deana Williams from the Department of Public Works because the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality has notified the County that it complies with state Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System Permit requirements. Permit compliance requires extensive work, including water quality monitoring, documentation, coordination with multiple agencies, and annual reporting.

They discussed the 2021 Legacy Program which recognizes nearly 30 companies that have operated in the County for over 50 years and hundreds of others who have spent decades here.
