MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Mr. Vithoulkas recognized Jeff Conley, Supplier Relations Manager in the Department of Finance, who was recently appointed to the Leadership Metropolitan Richmond (LMR) Board of Directors. In September 2018, Mr. Conley facilitated the inaugural "Growing Business Together Regional Expo," a collaborative program of Chesterfield County,

Hanover County, Henrico County, and the City of Richmond for small, women- and minority-owned companies interested in doing business with the localities.

The Manager also recognized Cari Tretina, Chief of Staff in the County Manager's Office, Bentley Chan, Director of Public Utilities, and Greg Baka, Tuckahoe District Planning Commissioner, who are members of the 2021 LMR program.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' COMMENTS

Mr. Schmitt noted the announcement of a joint partnership between Reynolds College and Toyota Motor Company to create an automobile facility on the Parham Road campus for the training of automobile technicians.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

The first four speakers asked the Board to reconsider the need for a civilian review board for police activities.

Paul Fleisher, a resident of the Varina District, stated he fully supports the County and the Police Division but feels a review board is necessary to ensure incidents that have happened in other areas don't happen in Henrico.

Karen Bosley, a resident of the Tuckahoe District, stated she is grateful for the hard work of Henrico officers but feels that violence and over-policing of black residents needs to be addressed.

Regina Tagger, a resident of the Tuckahoe District, stated she feels Henrico can be the example going forward.

Eileen Rodan, a resident of the Varina District, stated she was dismayed to learn only 25% of the Henrico Police Division are people of color and was disappointed that the Board failed to implement a civilian review board last year when the opportunity arose.

John Owens, a resident of the Brookland District, asked the Board to explore expansion of broadband access across the County, especially the Varina District.

Arthur Garthwright, a resident of the Fairfield District, voiced concerns about the streets in his neighborhood and incomplete road repairs.

Lois Caleb, a resident of the Fairfield District, asked the Board for attention to the trees hanging in the alley behind her home.

Chloe Edwards and Jessica Clary, members of Black Lives Matter 804, spoke in favor of a civilian review board in light of 112 complaints to the Henrico Police Division in 2020 and allegedly biased review by Internal Affairs.

Ralph Rome, a resident of the Fairfield District, gave a personal account of his dealings with police officers and supported establishment of a civilian review board.

Terrell Pollard, a resident of the Fairfield District, stated he is grateful for the Police Division but feels transparency about police actions is best.
