MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Mr. Hinton recognized a very special individual who has left an indelible mark not only on Henrico County's public safety team but also on the entire community. Specifically, Mr. Hinton shared that Anthony "Tony" McDowell has been named the first executive director of the newly created Virginia Opioid Abatement Authority. The Authority was created in 2021 to administer the Opioid Abatement Fund, which receives moneys from settlements, judgments, verdicts, and other court orders relating to claims regarding the manufacturing, distribution, or sale of opioids. Mr. Hinton continued by lauding Mr. McDowell and the many important public safety positions he has held and initiatives he has led as part of the Henrico County team.

Mr. McDowell was presented the Henrico County Manager's Medal of Honor, by Mr. Thornton on behalf of the entire Board of Supervisors and Henrico County Manager.

Mr. McDowell thanked the members of the Board and the County Manager. He stated this award means a lot to him. He said everything good the County does starts with a team and ends with a team, and he will not forget WWHD. The Board members thanked Mr. McDowell for all his efforts and all the projects he has helped.

Mr. Hinton next recognized Alec Oughton, Chief for the Division of Fire. Chief Oughton noted the Division of Fire lost a true hero on June 30; retired Lt. Willis Cameron "Buddy" Barnes passed away after a brief illness. Lt. Barnes faithfully served the Henrico community for 30 years. He was an outstanding firefighter, leader, and coach who spent many years on the Hazardous Incident Team. He died from cancer at age 57, just 5 years after retiring from the Division of Fire. Buddy was a devoted Christian whose faith grew stronger throughout his life, including the last days of his life. He was not sad or angry receiving his terminal diagnosis, because he had been preparing for death his entire life. He possessed a rare combination of spirituality, leadership, dedication, and honesty. While Buddy served the community with the utmost dedication and professionalism, he will always be remembered as a spiritual mentor, a devoted family man, and a beacon of faith. Buddy set a lasting example for Henrico Fire members to always follow: put God first, family second, and work third. Chief Oughton thanked the Board for allowing him the opportunity to remember Buddy this evening.

Mr. Hinton next invited Sgt. Brian Gill and Investigator Matthew Mealy to the podium, along with Colonel Montague, all of the Henrico County Sheriff's Office. Mr. Hinton shared thanks received from a community member, Brian Montgomery, for help received from Sgt. Gill and Inv. Mealy after the last Board meeting. The resident waited patiently for his GRTC Care transport, and after 20 minutes of waiting and calling with no success, these two gentlemen loaded Mr. Montgomery and his scooter into their personal vehicle, all while making sure the building was clear of everyone else and locking and securing the facility before taking him home for the night. Mr. Montgomery wanted the Manager and the Board

to know how grateful he was. Mr. Hinton asked the members of the Board and those in attendance to join him in a round of applause for these two outstanding employees.

Mr. Schmitt announced the passing of John Spence "Jack" Reid, a longtime Henrico County Delegate to the Virginia General Assembly, who passed on Sunday, July 17. Mr. Reid served as the Chairman of the Republican Party in the then third Congressional District and was a regular surrogate for Virginia's statewide Republican candidates for years before seeking office. He was the first Republican in the modern era elected to represent Henrico County in the Virginia House of Delegates. He also served on the Board of Directors of the West Richmond Kiwanis Club, the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, and Virginia Sports Hall of Fame, and he participated as a member of the Tuckahoe Masonic Lodge, the Acca Temple Shrine, and the West Richmond Businessmen's Association. Mr. Schmitt requested a moment of silence in remembrance of Delegate Reid and "Buddy" Barnes.

Mrs. O'Bannon announced the Mental Health and Developmental Services Board has announced the first ever Mary Ann Bergeron Hall of Fame Award, named after the late Mary Ann Bergeron. The first recipients of the award were Nita Grignol and the late George H. Hettrick. Mrs. O'Bannon stated the award recognizes individuals who have done outstanding work for the Mental Health and Developmental Services Board and for the community. She stated Nita served as the Tuckahoe District and George served as the Varina District representatives.

WHEREAS, Henrico County is the home of Lakeside Farmers Market. West End Farmers Market, and Dorey Park Farmers Market, each providing fresh produce, serving their respective communities, and creating space for local small businesses to thrive; and

WHEREAS, Lakeside Farmers Market was established in 2007 and is celebrating its 15th season this year; and

WHEREAS, during the pandemic, Lakeside Farmers Market provided a safe space for local churches, dance schools, cub and boy scouts, pop-up markets for Black-Queer-Trans, and other small, underserved businesses. Charities supported include Discovery United Methodist Church's food pantry, Lift Up Ukraine, Richmond's Angel Tree, ASK Childhood Cancer Foundation, the hematology and oncology services at Children's Hospital of Richmond at VCU, The Princess Project, and many others; and

WHEREAS, Dorey Park Farmers Market was established in 2018 to serve Eastern Henrico and its surrounding communities; and

WHEREAS, Dorey Park Farmers Market's mission is to provide all citizens with easy access to fresh and nutritious produce grown by local farms. Dorey Park Farmers Market encourages and supports local growers, farmers, and small businesses, as well as promoting equitable food access, good health and nutrition, environmental stewardship, and agriculture education through community outreach; and

WHEREAS, Dorey Park Farmers Market serves the community through its SNAP programs. Each dollar spent through SNAP is matched through a grant which doubles SNAP dollars, providing those customers greater access to nutritious fruits and vegetables. Dorey Park Farmers Market's "Little SNAPS" program provides even more SNAP dollars for the growing families throughout the community; and

WHEREAS. Dorey Park Farmers Market provides agricultural education to children through its POP Club (Power of Produce). ORDINANCE - To Reduce the Effective Tax Rate for Qualifying Vehicles in 2022 by Returning Surplus Personal Property Tax Revenues for Qualifying Vehicles to Taxpayers

WHEREAS, the County determines the value of certain vehicles for personal property taxes using a nationally recognized pricing guide, as required by Section 58.1-3503(A)(3), (4), (5), and (10) of the Code of Virginia ("qualifying vehicles"); and,

WHEREAS, the value of qualifying vehicles in the County increased on average by more than 35% in 2022, leading to higher personal property tax bills for many taxpayers; and,

WHEREAS, the General Assembly approved legislation in 2022 allowing localities to provide tax relief by reducing the tax rate for qualifying vehicles and returning surplus personal property tax revenues to taxpayers; and,

WHEREAS, the Board wishes to reduce the effective tax rate for qualifying vehicles from \$3.50 to \$2.98 in 2022 by providing a one-time credit equal to \$0.52 per \$100 of assessed value; and,

WHEREAS, the Board wishes to fund the credit from surplus personal property tax revenues; and,

WHEREAS, the director of finance reports, as of June 8, 2022, that the County has a surplus of personal property tax revenues for FY 2021-22 in the amount of \$22,239,884.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF HENRICO COUNTY, VIRGINIA:

1. Qualifying vehicles.

For purposes of this Ordinance, a "qualifying vehicle" is any vehicle classified by Section 58.1-3503(A)(3), (4), (5), and (10) of the Code of Virginia and assessed personal property taxes in the County for some or all of 2022. "Qualifying vehicle" does not include any vehicle: (i) assessed in the County for some or all of 2022 at a tax rate of \$1.00 or less per \$100 of assessed value, or (ii) for which no personal property tax was owed as a result of the personal property tax assessment for some or all of 2022, either because the vehicle is totally exempt from taxation or because the vehicle is subject to 100% tax relief pursuant to the Personal Property Tax Relief Act (Code of Virginia Title 58.1, Chapter 35.1).

2. <u>Credit and reduced effective tax rate for Qualifying Vehicles.</u>

For each qualifying vehicle, the director of finance will apply a one-time credit equal to \$0.52 per \$100 of the 2022 assessed value of the qualifying vehicle to reduce the effective tax rate for the qualifying vehicle from \$3.50 to \$2.98 per \$100 of assessed value.

3. **Application of credit.**

(a) The director of finance will begin applying the credits authorized by this ordinance prior to the mailing of bills for the installment of 2022 personal property taxes due and payable on December 5, 2022. No credit will be issued after January 31, 2023, unless the director determines that a credit was incorrectly omitted or misapplied for a qualifying vehicle through no fault of the taxpayer.

- (b) The credit for a qualifying vehicle assessed on a pro-rated basis in 2022 pursuant to Henrico County Code Section 20-109 will be pro-rated in the same proportion as the tax.
- (c) All credits under this ordinance will be paid solely from appropriations made for that purpose from fund balances resulting from surplus personal property tax revenues.
- 4. That this ordinance will be in full force and effect on after its passage as provided by law.
