MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Mr. Vithoulkas recognized Anthony Romanello, Executive Director of the Economic Development Authority (EDA), who recognized Jordan Tate, the Manager for Economic Development for Amazon Corporation. Mr. Romanello explained the current Amazon project off of Azalea Avenue is a 4.5 story, 2.6 million square foot Robotic Fulfillment Center that will create 1,000 new jobs. The EDA and Department of Public Works (DPW) quickly and thoughtfully navigated through the process of seeking to move the allocation of funding from the northern end to the southern end of Richmond-Henrico Turnpike to facilitate the Amazon project. Mr. Romanello thanked DPW and the County Manager's

Office for their critical assistance that paved the way for the project to succeed and was critical to the company's decision to locate in Henrico.

Ms. Tate thanked the Board and noted this is the largest building in Central Virginia. She presented the Board with the national Area Development/Gold Shovel Award. Mr. Thornton accepted the award on behalf of the Board of Supervisors.

Mr. Vithoulkas recognized Laura Totty, Director of Mental Health & Developmental Services, and Monica Smith-Callahan, Deputy County Manager for Community Affairs, who gave the Board an update on a special opportunity that took place earlier this month. Ms. Totty noted May is Mental Health Awareness Month, and on Wednesday, May 10, employees of Mental Health & Developmental Services staffed the NBC Call 12 hotline as part of their effort called Managing Your Mental Health: A Focus on Children and Teens. Ms. Totty noted they took a lot of calls and were able to share information about mental health services and community resources. Monica noted this opportunity was a result of NBC 12's support of Teen Summit RVA, which followed two stories by Mekia Turner who conducted a roundtable interview with regional students who participated in the Summit where the teens discussed challenges they have faced during these unprecedented times.

Mr. Vithoulkas noted this past Friday, May 19, Sheriff Gregory was recognized by Artisans for Action in RVA at their VIBE 2023 event. VIBE 2023 is an event that encourages positive relationships among community leaders through networking and increasing awareness of resources. Each annual event highlights community leaders whose work in the community aligns with the mission of Artisans for Action in RVA. The honorees were selected for being visionaries, inspiring, brokering and empowering our communities.





Revenue from the 8.0% Hotel/Motel Occupancy Tax is exceeding the estimate of \$14,000,000 included in FY2022-23 Annual Fiscal Plan. This \$3,500,000 increase will cover additional payments to the Greater Richmond Convention Center Authority (GRCCA) resulting from this additional revenue that has been received and is projected to be received through the end of the fiscal year. Payment will be made based on actual collections from the tax. Subsequently, the County's 2.0% local tax component (estimated at \$875,000 for this amendment) will come back to the County. In total, for FY2022-23, the County expects to receive \$17,500,000 in Hotel/Motel Occupancy Taxes, reflecting an increase when compared to the prior fiscal year. These funds will be disbursed to the GRCCA. Upon completion of the fiscal year, the GRCCA will return 2.0% of the 8.0%, estimated at \$4,375,000 per the Convention Center financing agreement.




