MANAGER'S COMMENTS

Mr. Vithoulkas recognized Yvette George, Director of Human Resources, who noted every year there is a Fall Team Rowing Challenge from September 15 through October 15. 

SUPPLEMENTAL RESOLUTION GRANTING AUTHORIZATION FOR THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$500,000) AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF WATER AND SEWER SYSTEM REVENUE BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF HENRICO, VIRGINIA FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING FUNDS TO PAY A PORTION OF THE COSTS OF A WATER LINE INVENTORY PROJECT FOR THE COUNTY'S WATER AND SEWER SYSTEM (THE "PROJECT"); PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS TO THE VIRGINIA RESOURCES AUTHORITY (THE "VRA"), AS FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATOR OF THE VIRGINIA DRINKING WATER STATE REVOLVING FUND; AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY TO ENTER INTO ONE OR MORE FUNDING AGREEMENTS WITH THE VRA FOR GRANT FUNDING TO BE PROVIDED TO THE COUNTY FROM THE VRA TO PAY A PORTION OF THE COSTS OF THE PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of the County of Henrico, Virginia (the "County") has adopted a Resolution, dated November 23, 1977, as amended and supplemented from time to time in accordance with the terms thereof, and as amended by Resolutions adopted by the Board on January 13, 1999, February 9, 1999, March 13, 2018 and September 22, 2020 (collectively, the "Water and Sewer Resolution"); and

WHEREAS, this Resolution shall constitute a "Supplemental Resolution" under the Water and Sewer Resolution and all defined terms used herein and not otherwise defined herein shall have the meanings given to such terms in the Water and Sewer Resolution; and

WHEREAS, in the judgment of the Board, it is desirable and in the best interests of the County to authorize the issuance of not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) aggregate principal amount of Water and Sewer System Revenue Bonds under and pursuant to the Water and Sewer Resolution to provide funds to pay a portion of the costs of a water line inventory project for the County's Water and Sewer System (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the County has submitted an application for financing for the Project from the Virginia Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Lead Elimination Assistance Program (the "Loan Program"); and

WHEREAS, the Virginia Department of Health (the "Department of Health") acts as the administrator of the Loan Program and the Virginia Resources Authority (the "VRA") acts as the financial administrator of the Loan Program; and

WHEREAS, the County will request funding from the Loan Program to finance a portion of the costs of the Project in an amount up to \$500,000 in the form of Water and Sewer System Revenue Bonds to be issued by the County under the Water and Sewer Resolution and purchased by the VRA, as financial administrator of the Loan Program (the "Bonds"), and additional funding in the principal amount of up to \$300,000 in the form of a grant (the "Principal Forgiveness Funding"); and

WHEREAS, the County and the VRA will enter into a Financing Agreement (the "Financing Agreement") providing for the purchase by the VRA of the Bonds to be issued by the County and a Funding Agreement (the "Funding Agreement") providing for the granting of the Principal Forgiveness Funding to the County; and

WHEREAS, in the judgment of the Board it is desirable and in the best interest of the County to issue the Bonds and to enter into the Funding Agreement for the receipt of the Principal Forgiveness Funding to provide funds to pay a portion of the costs of the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF HENRICO, VIRGINIA:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to Chapter 26 of Title 15.2 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, the same being the Public Finance Act of 1991, as amended (the "Public Finance Act"), and the Water and Sewer Resolution, there are authorized to be issued not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) aggregate principal amount of the Bonds to be designated "County of Henrico, Virginia, Water and Sewer System Revenue Bonds (Water Line Inventory Project)". The Bonds shall be issued for the purpose of providing funds to pay a portion of the costs of the Project. The Bonds may be issued in one or more series from time to time and shall bear such series designation as shall be determined by the County Manager or the Director of Finance (each an "Authorized Officer"). Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, in no event shall the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds issued hereunder exceed the aggregate principal amount of Bonds to be purchased by the VRA to pay costs of the Project, as set forth in the Commitment Letter of the VRA relating to the Bonds (the "Commitment Letter"), as the same may be amended or supplemented from time to time.

SECTION 2. The Bonds of each series shall be issued under the Water and Sewer Resolution to the VRA, as financial administrator of the Virginia Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (the "Fund"), pursuant to the terms, conditions and provisions of, and to evidence the borrowing to be made by the County from the VRA under the Commitment Letter (or any additional commitment letters from the VRA for Bonds of a series) and under a Financing Agreement for the Bonds of each series, as the same may be amended and supplemented from time to time (a "Financing Agreement" or, collectively, the "Financing Agreements"), by and between VRA, as financial administrator of the Fund, and the County, as the Borrower thereunder. Any Authorized Officer is each hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver to the VRA a Commitment Letter and a Financing Agreement for the Bonds of each series in such forms as such Authorized Officer executing the same shall approve upon the advice of counsel (including the County Attorney and Bond Counsel to the County), such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof by such Authorized Officer. In accordance with the terms, conditions and provisions of the Water and Sewer Resolution, the Commitment Letters and the Financing Agreements, as the same may be amended from time to time, the Bonds of each series shall have a term of not exceeding the term provided for in the Financing Agreement relating to the Bonds of such series as executed, shall bear interest (referred to as the "Cost of Funds" in each applicable Financing Agreement) at the rate of 1.0% per annum and shall mature on such dates (provided that the final maturity date of the Bonds of each series shall not be later than twenty-one (21) years after the date of issuance of

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the Bonds of such series) and in such principal amounts as shall be specified in the definitive forms of the Financing Agreements and the forms of the Bonds attached to the definitive forms of the Financing Agreements as Exhibit A thereto.

SECTION 3. The Revenues of the Water and Sewer System of the County are and shall be irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of the Bonds as the same become due and payable, and the Bonds shall be secured solely by and payable solely from such Revenues in accordance with the Water and Sewer Resolution. The Bonds shall be secured on a parity basis with the County's "Existing Parity Bonds" issued under the Water and Sewer Resolution and identified in the definitive forms of the Financing Agreements and any additional Parity Bonds issued in accordance with the Water and Sewer Resolution.

SECTION 4. The Bonds of each series (including any allonge or amendment thereto) shall be executed, for and on behalf of the County, by the manual or facsimile signature of the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the County and shall have the corporate seal of the County impressed or imprinted thereon, attested by the manual or facsimile signature of the Clerk or Deputy Clerk of Board of the County, and such Bonds shall be authenticated with the manual or facsimile signature of the Paying Agent.

The Bonds of each series shall be in substantially the form set forth as Exhibit A to the definitive form of the Financing Agreement relating to such series.

The Director of Finance is hereby authorized to serve as the Registrar and Paying Agent for the Bonds, or, alternatively, is authorized to appoint a qualified bank or trust company to serve as Registrar and Paying Agent for the Bonds.

SECTION 5. Any Authorized Officer, the County Attorney or any other appropriate officers and employees of the County shall take all actions and shall approve, execute and deliver such documents and certificates in connection with the execution and delivery of the Bonds and the Financing. Agreements as shall be necessary to carry out the provisions thereof and of the Water and Sewer Resolution and this Supplemental Resolution, including, but not limited to, a Tax Compliance Agreement, if any.

SECTION 6. Any Authorized Officer is each hereby authorized and directed to take all necessary steps to obtain the Principal Forgiveness Funding from the VRA in a principal amount of up to Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000) (or any such greater amount as may be made available by the VRA and approved by an Authorized Officer) and to execute and deliver to the VRA one or more Funding Agreements relating thereto in such form as the Authorized Officer executing the same shall approve upon the advice of counsel (including the County Attorney and Bond Counsel to the County), such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof by such Authorized Officer. Any Authorized Officer, the County Attorney or any other appropriate officers and employees of the County shall take all actions and shall approve, execute and deliver such documents and certificates in connection with the execution and delivery of one or more Funding Agreements and the acceptance of the Principal Forgiveness Funding as shall be necessary to carry out the provisions thereof and of the Water and Sewer Resolution and this Supplemental Resolution.

SECTION 7. All resolutions in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, repealed. The Water and Sewer Resolution, as supplemented by this Supplemental Resolution, shall constitute the "Local Resolution" as such term may be defined in the Financing Agreement.

SECTION 8. The County Attorney is hereby directed to file a copy of this Supplemental Resolution, certified by such Clerk of Board to be a true and correct copy hereof, with the Circuit Court of the County.

SECTION 9. The members of the Board and all officers, employees and agents of the County are hereby authorized to take such action as they or any one of them may consider necessary or desirable in connection with the issuance and sale of the Bonds and acceptance of the Principal Forgiveness Funding and any such action previously taken is hereby ratified and confirmed.

SECTION 10. The Board hereby authorizes the County to make expenditures for the purpose for which the Bonds are to be issued in advance of the issuance and receipt of the proceeds of the Bonds and to reimburse such expenditures from the proceeds of the Bonds. The adoption of this Supplemental Resolution shall be considered an "official intent" within the meaning of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 promulgated under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

SECTION 11. This Supplemental Resolution shall take effect upon its adoption.

RESOLUTION – APPROVAL OF ISSUANCE OF BONDS BY THE HARRISONBURG REDEVELOPMENT AND HOUSING AUTHORITY FOR THE HELIOS APARTMENTS – FAIRFIELD DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Henrico County, Virginia (the "Board"), is the governing body of Henrico County, Virginia (the "County"); and

WHEREAS, Helios Apartments (the "Apartments"), to be located at 5701 Chamberlayne Road in the Fairfield District of the County, will be an approximately 186-unit, multifamily housing development which will qualify as a "qualified residential rental project" within the meaning of Section 142(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"); and

WHEREAS, the proposed purchaser of the Apartments, 5701 Chamberlayne, LLC, a Virginia limited liability company (the "Purchaser"), has entered into contracts pursuant to which it will acquire and construct the Apartments; and

WHEREAS, the Purchaser will spend approximately \$260,000 per unit on labor and materials to construct the Apartments, which will include one-, two- and three-bedroom new affordable units, a community room with a workout facility, business center and lounge, a playground, dog run, and grilling area, vast green space, 30% brick exteriors, energy efficient faucets, toilets, and showerheads, LED lighting, Earthcraft Gold certification and an adjacent solar array for electric power; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with federal tax law which fosters private investments in affordable housing, the Purchaser wishes to access private funds from the capital markets through the sale of tax-exempt bonds in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$33,000,000 (the "Bonds") to finance a portion of the costs of the purchase and construction of the Apartments (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, in order to accomplish this, the Purchaser has sought assistance from the Harrisonburg Redevelopment and Housing Authority (the "Authority"), as the County does not have a redevelopment and housing authority organized pursuant to the Virginia Housing Authorities Law, Chapter 1, Title 36 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority held a public hearing on September 20, 2023, on the issuance of revenue bonds to assist in financing the Project and adopted a resolution on the same date agreeing to issue its bonds for such purpose, subject to, among other requirements, approval by the Board as required by Section 36-23 of the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Harrisonburg City Council adopted a resolution approving the issuance of the bonds on September 26, 2023; and

WHEREAS, Section 36-23 of the Act authorizes the Authority to provide financing assistance for multifamily residential housing developments in the County, provided the Board, after holding an advertised public hearing on the matter, adopts a resolution which declares a need for the Authority to exercise its powers within the County; and

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WHEREAS, Section 36-23 of the Act requires further that before the Authority may issue bonds to assist with the Project, the consent must be obtained from any other housing authority with bonds outstanding on a project in the County; and

WHEREAS, each of the Suffolk Redevelopment and Housing Authority (the "Suffolk Authority") and the Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority (the "Richmond Authority") has bonds outstanding to assist in financing projects in the County, and, at the request of the Authority, each of the Suffolk Authority and the Richmond Authority has expressed its consent to the issuance by the Authority of bonds to assist with the Project; and

WHEREAS, certified copies of the resolutions of the Authority and Harrisonburg City Council have been filed with the County evidencing the actions taken by the respective bodies; and

WHEREAS, the Board has held an advertised public hearing on November 28, 2023, regarding the need for the Authority to exercise its powers in the County as required by Section 36-23 of the Act following notice of such hearing in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, published in a newspaper of general circulation within the County at least seven (7) days prior to the date set for such hearing as required by Section 36-23 of the Act; and

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WHEREAS, the Board has held an additional, concurrent public hearing on November 28, 2023, on the Apartments and the issuance of the Bonds as required by Section 15.2-4906 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended (the "Virginia Code"), and Section 147(f) of the Code, following notice of such hearing in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B, published in a newspaper of general circulation within the County at least seven (7) days prior to the date set for such hearing as required by the applicable public hearing requirements of the Code and the Virginia Code; and

WHEREAS, a fiscal impact statement complying with the requirements of Section 15.2-4907 of the Virginia Code relating to the Apartments has been filed with the Board; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Purchaser have negotiated the Agreement and Memorandum of Understanding, in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit C (the "Agreement"), that creates certain operational and maintenance standards for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the advertised public hearings provided opportunities for interested persons to be heard, for the expressions of opinion, for arguments on the merits, and for the introduction of documentary evidence pertinent to the proposed issuance of the Bonds and the Authority's exercise of its powers in the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Henrico County, Virginia, as follows:

1. The Board acknowledges that with the assistance of the Authority through the issuance of its tax-exempt bonds, the financing would enable the Apartments to be constructed in the County and the available housing opportunities for prospective tenants in the surrounding environs of the County would consequently be expanded and improved, and therefore the Board hereby declares that there is a need for the Authority to exercise its powers within the County.

2. The Board finds, as required by Section 36-23 of the Act, that the dwelling accommodations to be available to prospective tenants in the Apartments could be significantly improved and made substantially safer if the Authority exercises its powers within the territorial boundaries of the County.

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3. The Board makes the appropriate findings as required by Section 36-23 of the Act, acknowledges the consent provided by the Suffolk Authority and the Richmond Authority, and approves the issuance of the Bonds by the Authority for the Apartments, as required by Section 147(f) of the Code and Section 15.2-4906 of the Virginia Code.

4. The Board approves the Agreement in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit C.

5. The Board's approval of this resolution is contingent upon immediate execution of the Agreement.

6. This approval does not constitute an endorsement to prospective purchasers of the Bonds or of the creditworthiness of the Apartments, the Project, or the Purchaser.

7. The issuance of the Bonds shall not create a debt or pledge of the full faith and credit of the Commonwealth of Virginia, the County, the City of Harrisonburg, Virginia, or the Authority.

8. This resolution applies exclusively to the Project. Nothing contained herein shall be construed to authorize or permit the Authority to exercise its powers or engage in any other project financing except as authorized by this resolution.

9. This resolution will take effect immediately upon its adoption and will remain in effect for a period of one year from the date of its adoption.

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AGREEMENT AND MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

THIS AGREEMENT AND MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (this "Agreement") is made by and between the **County of Henrico, Virginia**, a political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Virginia (the "County") and **5701 Chamberlayne**, **LLC**, a Virginia limited liability company (the "Owner"). The County and Owner may each be referred to individually as a "Party" and may be referred to collectively as the "Parties."

RECITALS

- A. The Owner is the contract purchaser of certain real property in Henrico County, Virginia, consisting of approximately 8.196 acres of land, with addresses of 5701 Chamberlayne Road and 5700 Crenshaw Road, Henrico, VA 23227, and described further in <u>Exhibit A</u> (including all improvements now or hereafter existing thereon, the "Property").
- B. The Owner intends to construct and equip a multifamily residential rental housing facility on the Property to be known as the Helios Apartments, consisting of a four-story building and a three-story building containing 186 rental units (one-, two-, and three-bedroom units); a community room with a workout facility, business center, and lounge; a playground, dog run, and grilling area; vast green space; 30% brick exteriors; energy efficient faucets, toilets, and showerheads; LED lighting; Earthcraft Gold certification; and an adjacent solar array for electric power (the "Project").
- C. The Owner intends to pursue tax-exempt bond financing and tax credit equity to fund the construction and equipping of the Project (the "Financing").
- D. The Owner has obtained an inducement resolution from the Harrisonburg Redevelopment and Housing Authority for the issuance of its bonds in an amount not to exceed \$33,000,000 to finance the acquisition, construction, and equipping of the Project.
- E. The Owner requested that the Board of Supervisors of Henrico County, Virginia (the "Board of Supervisors") adopt a resolution on November 28, 2023, authorizing the Harrisonburg Redevelopment and Housing Authority to issue bonds to finance the acquisition, construction, and equipping of the Project (the "Resolution"). A copy of the Resolution, as proposed, is attached to this Agreement as <u>Exhibit B</u>.

F. In consideration of the adoption of the Resolution by the Board of Supervisors, the Owner commits to undertaking certain activities with respect to the Property and the Project upon closing of the Financing.

UNDERSTANDING AND AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Incorporation of Recitals</u>. The recitals are incorporated into, and are part of, this Agreement.
- 2. <u>Term; Recording of Memorandum of Agreement</u>. This Agreement has a term of 30 years from the date of adoption of the Resolution by the Board of Supervisors. During its term, this Agreement inures to the benefit of, and is binding on, the Parties, their successors, their permitted assigns, and subsequent owners of the Property (and any portion of the Property). Following the adoption of the Resolution by the Board of Supervisors, the Parties will promptly record this Agreement in the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court of Henrico County, Virginia.

3. <u>Condition of Property</u>.

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a. The Owner covenants to construct, equip, and maintain the Property in a decent, safe, and sanitary manner in accordance with the applicable Minimum Design and Construction Requirements of the Virginia Housing Development Authority ("VHDA"), and applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations, including, without limitation, the Virginia Uniform Statewide Building Code (including the Virginia Maintenance Code) and all zoning and land use ordinances. The Owner covenants to keep all on-site improvements in good condition and to repair the same in accordance with the standards set out above, promptly repairing or replacing any materials which are damaged or otherwise out of repair. On-site improvements include, but are in no way limited to, paving and sidewalks, recreational areas, doors and windows, roofing, landscaping, lighting, signage, fences, gutters and downspouts, trash enclosures, and facade materials and finishes. The Owner covenants to keep facades free of mold and graffiti.

b. The Owner agrees to provide to the County, through the County Manager (or his designee), a copy of any physical inspection report undertaken by VHDA, within five days of the report being provided to the Owner. If the Owner intends to appeal or otherwise contest any portion of the report, the Owner will inform the County of its intent to appeal or contest the report, identifying those portions which the Owner intends to appeal or contest, and thereafter keep the County apprised of the status of its appeal or contest. Upon a final determination of the appeal by VHDA, the Owner will promptly notify the County of VHDA's findings and decision and provide to the County all documents related to the inspection and resolution of the appeal. Further, the Owner agrees to cure any deficiency identified in such report within ten business days of receiving notice of the deficiency, or, if such deficiency cannot be reasonably cured in such ten-business-day period, such longer period as may be necessary to cure such deficiency provided that the Owner is diligently pursuing a cure of such deficiency. If the deficiency presents an imminent threat to the safety of residents at the Property, then the Owner will cure the deficiency as soon as reasonably possible. The Owner will allow County officials and employees to inspect the Property in accordance with Sections 8 and 9 of this Agreement.

- 4. Educational and Skill-Building Programs. The Owner agrees to provide residents at the Property with educational programs. All such programs must be provided on-site (or if off-site, at a reasonably convenient location for residents), free of charge, or for a nominal amount, and must be provided at times that are reasonably convenient for residents. Such programs may include, without limitation, tutoring (including language tutoring), computer training, financial literacy, resume building, job interviewing, parenting, mentoring, or other programs based on the needs of residents. Upon request by the County, the Owner will also provide residents information concerning drug and alcohol abuse treatment options available within the County. The Owner further agrees to reserve space on-site for a minimum of two (2) hours per month for County- and Owner-approved third parties to provide additional education and skill-building programs to residents.
- 5. <u>Health and Wellness Activities</u>. The Owner agrees to offer residents health and wellness programs throughout the year free of charge, or for a nominal amount. The Owner further agrees to reserve space on-site for a minimum of eight hours per month for County- and Owner-approved third parties to provide additional health and wellness programs to residents. Such programs may include, without limitation, recreation, exercise, physical health, nutrition, asthma education, smoking cessation, and mental health (e.g., mindfulness, meditation, crafts, resiliency training) programming.
- 6. <u>Cooperation with Local Law Enforcement and Security Plan.</u> The Owner covenants to cooperate, and cause its property manager to cooperate, with local law enforcement agencies. The Owner further covenants to participate, and cause its property manager to participate, in any programs recommended by such agencies to reduce and prevent crime and to ensure the safety and well-being of all residents at the Property. Without

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limiting the generality of the Owner's obligations under this section, the Owner agrees to establish a Neighborhood Watch program for the Property.

7. Security Improvements.

a. Within 180 days after the date of adoption of the Resolution by the Board of Supervisors, the Owner covenants to develop a security and crime prevention plan prepared by a third-party crime prevention consultant, in consultation with the Henrico County Police Division (the "Division"), and submit such plan to the Division for review and approval. The plan must follow the principles stated in Division 5 of Article 5 of the County's zoning ordinance ("Lighting and Crime Prevention Principles"). The Division will have 60 days to review and approve or disapprove the submission. If the Division disapproves the submission, the Division will identify corrections with reference to the Lighting and Crime Prevention Principles that will allow the Division to approve the submission. Following receipt of comments from the Division, the Owner will have 30 days to incorporate such comments and resubmit the plan for approval. This process will repeat until the Division approves the Owner's submission. Once approved by the Division, the approved security and crime prevention plan will be part of this Agreement and enforceable in accordance with its terms and the terms of this Agreement.

b. The Owner covenants to implement the approved security and crime prevention plan and maintain the Property in accordance with the same.

c. Prior to issuance of a certificate of occupancy, the Owner covenants to install functioning closed-circuit video recording devices that provide coverage for all vehicular and pedestrian entrance areas, walkways, parking areas, building breezeways, and all community facilities (including playgrounds). The devices must provide at least 30 days of recorded video that will be available to law-enforcement upon request. The Owner further covenants to maintain the devices in good repair and working condition at all times following their installation.

8. <u>Audit and Access</u>. The Owner agrees that the County may conduct semi-annual audits of the conditions at the Property to ensure compliance with the terms of this Agreement and applicable federal, state, or local laws or regulations. Within three business days of receiving a request from the County, the Owner will provide access to the Owner's annual work order report, which must include, at a minimum, a list of all resident work requests and corresponding work performed by the Owner. The Owner further agrees to provide County employees and agents with access to the Property as necessary to investigate reported complaints and incidents.

9. Annual Inspection by County Employees.

a. In addition to the County's audit and access rights in Section 8, the Owner agrees to provide County employees with access to the Property for quarterly inspections to ensure compliance with this Agreement and federal, state, and local laws and regulations pertaining to the condition of the Property. During such inspections, the County may inspect up to five percent of the units at the Property. The Owner agrees to cooperate with the County to obtain the permission of individual residents as necessary to fulfill this requirement, and the County will provide the Owner with sufficient advance notice of such inspections to permit the Owner to give residents at least seven days' prior notice.

b. If the inspections reveal noncompliance with this Agreement or with federal, state, or local laws or regulations pertaining to the condition of the Property, the Owner agrees to permit the County to inspect up to an additional five percent of the units. The Owner further agrees to cure any deficiency identified by County employees within ten business days of receiving notice of the deficiency, or, if such deficiency cannot be reasonably addressed in such ten-business-day period, such longer period as may be necessary to cure such deficiency provided that the Owner is diligently pursuing a cure of such deficiency. If the deficiency presents an imminent threat to the safety of residents at the Property, then the Owner will cure the deficiency as soon as reasonably possible.

c. Quarterly inspections under this section will commence upon issuance of a certificate of occupancy.

d. Nothing in this Agreement limits the authority of the County to enforce the provisions of the Virginia Uniform Statewide Building Code (including the Virginia Maintenance Code) or any other applicable laws or ordinances.

10. <u>On-site Property Manager</u>. The Owner will ensure that at least one full-time property management employee is on site Monday through Saturday during regular business hours at the Property with authority to serve as a contact for the County during regular business hours. The Owner will also ensure that emergency management support is available twenty-four hours a day, seven days per week, and will provide the County with an authorized contact outside of regular business hours.

11. <u>Background Checks</u>. The Owner covenants that all background checks on prospective residents will be conducted in accordance with federal, state, and local laws, including all fair housing laws, and that it will comply with federal, state, and local laws pertaining to the use and disposal of background information obtained on prospective residents.

12. Subsequent Owners; Assignments.

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a. During the term of this Agreement, the Owner may transfer ownership of the Property only with the prior written consent of the County, which may be conditioned only on the transferee's agreement to assume all the obligations and responsibilities of the Owner under this Agreement prior to such transfer. The Owner covenants and agrees to require any third party, including any affiliate of the Owner, that acquires all or any portion of the Owner's ownership interest in the Property, to assume in writing all the obligations and responsibilities of the Owner under this Agreement. The Owner further covenants and agrees to make the assumption of the Owner's obligations and responsibilities under this Agreement by such third party a condition precedent to the transfer of ownership to such third party.

b. The Owner may not otherwise assign this Agreement or any portion thereof without the prior written consent of the County, and any assignment in violation of this Agreement will be null and void.

- 13. <u>Consequences of Breach.</u> In the event of a breach by the Owner of any of the terms of this Agreement, and upon the Owner's receipt of written notice of the breach from the County, the Owner will have ten business days to cure the breach to the reasonable satisfaction of the County or, if such breach cannot reasonably be cured in ten business days, such longer period as may be necessary to cure such breach provided that the Owner is diligently pursuing a cure of such breach. If the breach presents an imminent threat to the safety of residents at the Property, then the Owner will cure the deficiency as soon as reasonably possible. If the Owner fails to cure a breach within the applicable cure period, the County may take any action at law or in equity, including seeking specific performance, to obtain a remedy for such breach. If the County is successful in such action against the Owner, the Owner agrees to pay all costs and reasonable attorneys' fees expended by the County in pursuing such action.
- 14. <u>Compliance by Owner with VHDA Requirements</u>. If a requirement of this Agreement is inconsistent with any requirement imposed by the VHDA, the more stringent requirement controls, except that this Agreement will not be construed to require any

act or omission prohibited by any requirement imposed by the VHDA.

15. <u>Notices.</u> Any notice under this Agreement will be sufficiently given when delivered by (i) United State first-class mail, postage prepaid, (ii) Federal Express or similar overnight delivery service, or (ii) by hand, to the address of the receiving Party below:

A Party may require notices to be sent to a different address by giving notice to the other Party in accordance with this section. All notices or other communications required or permitted hereunder must be in writing and will be deemed to have been given on (x) the third day after deposit in the United States first-class mail, postage prepaid, (y) the first day after deposit with Federal Express or similar overnight delivery service, or (iii) delivery if delivered by hand.

16. Miscellaneous.

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a. This Agreement, including the exhibits attached hereto, constitutes the entire contract between the parties, supersedes all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, representations, or statements, oral or written, regarding the subject matter of this Agreement. This Agreement may not be changed except in writing signed by both Parties. The failure of either Party to insist upon the strict performance of any provision of this Agreement will not be deemed to be a waiver of the right of such Party to insist upon the strict performance of such provision or of any other provision of this Agreement at any time. b. If any court of competent jurisdiction holds any provision of this Agreement invalid, then (i) such holding will not invalidate any other provision of this Agreement, unless such provision is contingent on the invalidated provision; and (ii) the remaining terms will constitute the Parties' entire agreement.

c. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, all of which taken together will constitute one and the same agreement, and any of the Parties to this Agreement may execute this Agreement by signing any of the counterparts.

d. This Agreement is governed by, and will be construed and interpreted in accordance with, the law of the Commonwealth of Virginia without giving effect to its conflict of laws principles. The exclusive venue for actions regarding this Agreement is the Henrico County Circuit Court.

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RESOLUTION – APPROVAL OF ISSUANCE OF BONDS BY THE HARRISONBURG REDEVELOPMENT AND HOUSING AUTHORITY FOR THE HELIOS APARTMENTS – FAIRFIELD DISTRICT

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WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Henrico County, Virginia (the "Board"), is the governing body of Henrico County, Virginia (the "County"); and

WHEREAS, Helios Apartments (the "Apartments"), to be located at 5701 Chamberlayne Road in the Fairfield District of the County, will be an approximately 186-unit, multifamily housing development which will qualify as a "qualified residential rental project" within the meaning of Section 142(d) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"); and

WHEREAS, the proposed purchaser of the Apartments, 5701 Chamberlayne, LLC, a Virginia limited liability company (the "Purchaser"), has entered into contracts pursuant to which it will acquire and construct the Apartments; and

WHEREAS, the Purchaser will spend approximately \$260,000 per unit on labor and materials to construct the Apartments, which will include one-, two- and three-bedroom new affordable units, a community room with a workout facility, business center and lounge, a playground, dog run, and grilling area, vast green space, 30% brick exteriors, energy efficient faucets, toilets, and showerheads, LED lighting, Earthcraft Gold certification and an adjacent solar array for electric power; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with federal tax law which fosters private investments in affordable housing, the Purchaser wishes to access private funds from the capital markets through the sale of tax-exempt bonds in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$33,000,000 (the "Bonds") to finance a portion of the costs of the purchase and construction of the Apartments (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, in order to accomplish this, the Purchaser has sought assistance from the Harrisonburg Redevelopment and Housing Authority (the "Authority"), as the County does not have a redevelopment and housing authority organized pursuant to the Virginia Housing Authorities Law, Chapter 1, Title 36 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority held a public hearing on September 20, 2023, on the issuance of revenue bonds to assist in financing the Project and adopted a resolution on the same date agreeing to issue its bonds for such purpose, subject to, among other requirements, approval by the Board as required by Section 36-23 of the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Harrisonburg City Council adopted a resolution approving the issuance of the bonds on September 26, 2023; and

WHEREAS, Section 36-23 of the Act authorizes the Authority to provide financing assistance for multifamily residential housing developments in the County, provided the Board, after holding an advertised public hearing on the matter, adopts a resolution which declares a need for the Authority to exercise its powers within the County; and

WHEREAS, Section 36-23 of the Act requires further that before the Authority may issue bonds to assist with the Project, the consent must be obtained from any other housing authority with bonds outstanding on a project in the County; and

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WHEREAS, each of the Suffolk Redevelopment and Housing Authority (the "Suffolk Authority") and the Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority (the "Richmond Authority") has bonds outstanding to assist in financing projects in the County, and, at the request of the Authority, each of the Suffolk Authority and the Richmond Authority has expressed its consent to the issuance by the Authority of bonds to assist with the Project; and

WHEREAS, certified copies of the resolutions of the Authority and Harrisonburg City Council have been filed with the County evidencing the actions taken by the respective bodies; and

WHEREAS, the Board has held an advertised public hearing on November 28, 2023, regarding the need for the Authority to exercise its powers in the County as required by Section 36-23 of the Act following notice of such hearing in the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, published in a newspaper of general circulation within the County at least seven (7) days prior to the date set for such hearing as required by Section 36-23 of the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Board has held an additional, concurrent public hearing on November 28, 2023, on the Apartments and the issuance of the Bonds as required by Section 15.2-4906 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended (the "Virginia Code"), and Section 147(f) of the Code, following notice of such hearing in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B, published in a newspaper of general circulation within the County at least seven (7) days prior to the date set for such hearing as required by the applicable public hearing requirements of the Code and the Virginia Code; and

WHEREAS, a fiscal impact statement complying with the requirements of Section 15.2-4907 of the Virginia Code relating to the Apartments has been filed with the Board; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Purchaser have negotiated the Agreement and Memorandum of Understanding, in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit C (the "Agreement"), that creates certain operational and maintenance standards for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the advertised public hearings provided opportunities for interested persons to be heard, for the expressions of opinion, for arguments on the merits, and for the introduction of documentary evidence pertinent to the proposed issuance of the Bonds and the Authority's exercise of its powers in the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Henrico County, Virginia, as follows:

1. The Board acknowledges that with the assistance of the Authority through the issuance of its tax-exempt bonds, the financing would enable the Apartments to be constructed in the County and the available housing opportunities for prospective tenants in the surrounding

environs of the County would consequently be expanded and improved, and therefore the Board hereby declares that there is a need for the Authority to exercise its powers within the County.

2. The Board finds, as required by Section 36-23 of the Act, that the dwelling accommodations to be available to prospective tenants in the Apartments could be significantly improved and made substantially safer if the Authority exercises its powers within the territorial boundaries of the County.

3. The Board makes the appropriate findings as required by Section 36-23 of the Act, acknowledges the consent provided by the Suffolk Authority and the Richmond Authority, and approves the issuance of the Bonds by the Authority for the Apartments, as required by Section 147(f) of the Code and Section 15.2-4906 of the Virginia Code.

4. The Board approves the Agreement in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit C.

5. The Board's approval of this resolution is contingent upon immediate execution of the Agreement.

6. This approval does not constitute an endorsement to prospective purchasers of the Bonds or of the creditworthiness of the Apartments, the Project, or the Purchaser.

7. The issuance of the Bonds shall not create a debt or pledge of the full faith and credit of the Commonwealth of Virginia, the County, the City of Harrisonburg, Virginia, or the Authority.

8. This resolution applies exclusively to the Project. Nothing contained herein shall be construed to authorize or permit the Authority to exercise its powers or engage in any other project financing except as authorized by this resolution.

9. This resolution will take effect immediately upon its adoption and will remain in effect for a period of one year from the date of its adoption.




