## Gentlemen:

The Board of Supervisors at its meeting on January 22, granted your request for a revocable Provisional Use Permit in order to construct and operate a communication tower and antennae up to 165 feet in height and related facilities on part of Parcel 103-B2-4, subject to the following conditions:

- If advances in technology eliminate the need for this tower, and it is no longer needed for cellular transmission, it shall be removed from the site as soon as possible.
- 2. Any UHF, VHF or other type of receivers/transmitters that would interfere with the County's Division of Police emergency communications be prohibited from this tower.
- 3. Application for a building permit to install the tower must be made within one year after the Provisional Use Permit is granted by the Board of Supervisors. The application for a building permit should include determination of any Chesapeake Bay Preservation Areas and compliance with the Chesapeake Bay Preservation Act provisions of the Henrico County Code.
- 4. Adequate erosion and sedimentation control measures shall be installed prior to any land disturbances. Erosion and sedimentation control measures shall be approved by the Environmental Control Engineer and inspected prior to any land disturbance on the site.
- 5. The tower will support no more than three (3) microwave dish antennas, no larger than 96 inches in diameter.
