For the second consecutive year, Henrico County will be participating in Take Our Daughters to Work Day, a national program sponsored by the Ms. Foundation, on Thursday, April 24. The program is designed to improve self-esteem, values, and provide career counseling to girls between the ages of nine and 15.

"We're expecting more than 100 girls to be here in the County buildings on Thursday," said Human Resource Information Systems Manager Jane Klosky. "We know that at least one of the deputy county managers plans to bring his daughter to work, and the enthusiastic participation has filtered throughout every rank in the County's personnel complement," she said.

The girls will arrive at 8 a.m. on Thursday with a full day already planned for them. As well as performing "hands on" job functions with their individual sponsor or parent, the girls will be visiting the Division of Police's 911-Communications Center, the Division of Fire's training program, and the Sheriff's Office, to name a few.

The day will conclude at 4 p.m. with a ceremony in the Board Room. Each girl will receive a certificate for her participation, and the sole female member of the County Board of Supervisors, Patricia S. O'Bannon, will address the girls with her own words of encouragement.

"Henrico's Financial Stability" will be the topic of Board Chairman and Varina Supervisor Jim Donati's next town meeting on Monday, April 21, at 7 p.m., at the Eastern Government Center, 3820 Nine Mile Road.

"Henrico has maintained a triple-A bond rating from both Moody's and Standard and Poor's - the top two rating firms in the country - for 20 years," Donati said. "This accomplishment requires strategic financial planning and long-term debt management - it's not a given. We want to share with Varina residents how we earned the honor of being one of the top 10 or 12 counties in the entire nation, and how we intend to stay there," he said.

Deputy County Manger for Administration Leon T. Johnson will join Donati in presenting the details, and reviewing some of the information he presented to the Board of Supervisors and the School Board in a Washington, D.C. retreat meeting last month.

Donati holds Varina town meetings the third Monday of each month. The meetings are open to the public.
