The Henrico County Health Department will hold flu clinics on the first three Fridays in October. Health care staff will administer vaccines on October 2, 9, and 16, from 8:30 a.m. until 11:30 a.m., at the East Clinic, 3810 Nine Mile Road, and at the West Clinic, 8600 Dixon Powers Drive.

Flu vaccines cost \$10 and pneumonia vaccines are available for \$16. The clinics will provide Medicare billing for both shots; participants must bring their Medicare Part-B card.

Henrico County Department of Public Works advises motorists to expect traffic delays on Saturday, October 10, beginning at 12:45 p.m., due to Highland Springs High School's Homecoming Parade.
