Last year more than \$25 million in Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) funds went unclaimed in the Richmond metropolitan area. To combat the problem, Henrico County, through the Greater Richmond EITC Coalition, is helping low-income working families prepare tax returns to receive refunds.

Area residents interested in helping can volunteer to join the effort. Henrico County will serve as a site for VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance), an IRS program that provides free tax services for qualifying individuals. Volunteers are needed at various VITA sites to help low-income working families prepare returns, greet and screen taxpayers and assist with childcare. Previous experience is not required. The county will host tax return preparation training sessions for volunteers tailored to their level of expertise. Sessions are set for December and January. Volunteers will then serve four hours per week from Jan. 21 to April 15 at a VITA site of their choice. Businesses, groups and organizations are welcome to participate and may schedule additional training dates for their employees or members.

The Greater Richmond EITC Coalition, an organization of local governments, state and federal agencies, faith-based and non-profit organizations and private corporations and businesses, is spearheading this effort to ensure the area's eligible taxpayers - working families who often don't realize they qualify for the tax credit - receive the appropriate refund for income taxes paid in 2002.
