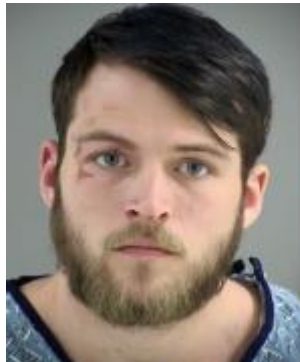

Henrico Police Issues a Scam Alert

Henrico Police is making the public aware of a scam targeting local businesses.

Henrico Police has been made aware of a scam being perpetrated by a fraudulent company offering advertising services to local businesses. The victim business receives an unsolicited telephone call from a person representing the company as an associate of a local high school booster club. The company offers banner space, T-shirts, and other sporting event promotional items to the business and suggests that a portion of the proceeds will go to support school athletics. If purchased, the company says they will send the promotional items to the local high school to be displayed or given away at sporting events.

The scam starts with the use of telemarketing and progresses to e-mail correspondence. A series of official-looking documents and detailed correspondences are sent to the victim business. Once payment is received, a small sample of inferior products is shipped, but the complete order is never delivered. This fraudulent promotion is not associated with any Henrico County school. The high schools do not receive any monetary proceeds that the fraudulent company promises will be donated to the school.

To avoid being a victim, businesses are encouraged not to participate in an unsolicited offer for advertisement benefitting school athletics without verifying its authenticity. If a business wishes to participate, it is recommended that someone contact a representative from the school to confirm the legitimacy of the promotion.

On March 21, 2018 at approximately 3:10 p.m., Henrico Police encountered an occupied vehicle in the 800 block of E. Parham Road. While speaking with the driver, the driver sped away in a reckless manner. A separate officer observed the vehicle southbound on Brook Road and attempted to stop it. The vehicle failed to stop, and a brief pursuit ensued. The pursuit was terminated after getting on I95 due to the driver's identity being known. The vehicle continued southbound on I95 into the City of Richmond where it crashed near Belvedere Street. This incident was resolved due to the collaborative effort of the Henrico County Police Division, The Richmond Police Department and the Virginia State Police. The Virginia Department of Transportation also played a significant role in this incident.

The Henrico County Police Division along with the U. S. Drug Enforcement Administration will participate in the nationwide Prescription Drug Take Back Program. This will take place on **Saturday, April 28, 2018 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.** at three locations in Henrico County.

- **Henrico Training Center, 7701 E. Parham Road** (access from Shrader Road).
- **Varina Public Library, 1875 New Market Road**
- **Eastern Henrico Recreation Center, 1440 N. Laburnum Avenue**

The program is free and anonymous. Unused or expired pills and patches will be accepted. Liquids, needles and sharp items will **not** be accepted. No questions will be asked.

Last October Americans turned in 456 tons (900,000 pounds) of prescription drugs at more than 5,300 sites operated by the DEA and over 4,200 of its state and local law enforcement partners.

This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. In addition, Americans are now advised that their usual methods for disposing of unused medicines—flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash—pose potential safety and health hazards.

Traffic Advisory for NASCAR Races

Traffic patterns will temporarily be altered on roads around Richmond Raceway on Friday, April 20 and Saturday, April 21, 2018, to accommodate fans attending the NASCAR races.

Motorists are advised to expect heavy traffic and delays in the area on both days, especially on Saturday before and after the race from 8:00 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. and from 9:30 p.m. to 2:00 a.m.

Henrico Police officers will direct motorists before and after the races. Race fans and other motorists are encouraged to check traffic updates on message boards along interstates and other roads approaching the raceway. WRVA-1140 AM will broadcast traffic reports. Updates will also be posted on the Police Division's Twitter account @henricopolice and Henrico Police Facebook site.

The following traffic patterns will be in effect Saturday, April 21 during peak hours:

- Carolina Avenue between Laburnum and Azalea avenues will be one-way outbound after the race. Access to businesses along Carolina Avenue will be maintained from Laburnum Avenue.
- Richmond-Henrico Turnpike/Meadowbridge Road from the Henrico/Hanover county line to Azalea Avenue will be one-way southbound from about 1:00 p.m., until the race starts. Sections of Meadowbridge Road farther north in Hanover County will continue to accommodate two-way northbound and southbound traffic at all times.
- After the race, Laburnum Avenue from Carolina Avenue to Mechanicsville Turnpike will be one-way eastbound. Eastbound Laburnum Avenue from Richmond-Henrico Turnpike/Meadowbridge Road to Carolina Avenue will be closed until race traffic disperses. Two-way traffic will be maintained on Laburnum Avenue west of Richmond-Henrico Turnpike/Meadowbridge Road.
- After the race, beginning at approximately 10:00 p.m., Richmond-Henrico Turnpike/Meadowbridge Road north of Azalea Avenue will be one-way northbound to Atlee Road in Hanover County. Richmond-Henrico Turnpike/Meadowbridge Road will be restored to two-way traffic when race traffic disperses.

- There is no longer a shuttle service from downtown. However, there are over 800 acres of free parking on site.
- Lyft and Uber will enter Gate 4, pick-up/drop-off, and exit Gate 5.
- Please note Gate 6 on Carolina Avenue and Gate 2 on Laburnum Avenue are designated as permit-only entry gates. If you do not have a permit, you will need to access Lot D via Gate 4 for FREE parking (first come, first serve).
- There is no public parking in Gate 10.

On **Saturday, May 5, from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.**, the two departments will conduct a document shredding and electronics recycling event. This will take place at **1400 Best Plaza Drive** (Off East Parham Road – one block east of I-95)

Citizens will be able to have personal documents securely shredded for free on site by Gone4Good. Additionally, citizens will be able to responsibly dispose of unwanted electronics by recycling them. Computer systems and accessories, printers, scanners, copiers, FAX machines, VCRs, camcorders, stereos, microwave ovens and other electronic items may be recycled free.

There is a fee to recycle old televisions. \$23 for TVs smaller than 27" and \$30 for TVs larger than 30".

Citizens may bring up to two boxes (10"x13"x18") or three paper grocery bags of personal documents only. No recyclable paper items will be accepted for shredding. The electronics recycling does not accept compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs), refrigerators, dehumidifiers, or air conditioners.

Richmond Area Media Representatives:

In collaboration, the chief law enforcement officers of Chesterfield, Henrico, and Richmond write to inform you that our agencies will be encrypting police radio frequencies on July 2, 2018. Once this change occurs, law enforcement radio transmissions can only be monitored by authorized public safety personnel.

There are two reasons area law enforcement agencies are moving to encrypt their radio transmissions:

The first reason is to promote the safety of first responders and community members by ensuring that the dissemination of in-progress tactics and activities during high-risk events is limited to those whose mission is to resolve events swiftly and with minimal risk to those involved. The second reason is to ensure that sensitive personal information being communicated to resolve an event does not violate legal rights or reasonable expectations of privacy.

We are mindful of the impact that police radio encryption may have on our media partners. In response, we have tasked our staffs with developing alternative ways of keeping you informed of active, real-time information. Though each agency's approach may vary somewhat, the objective of each is to work with and support you as you fulfill your mission.

In the near future our public information officers will be communicating with you about how our respective agencies will be enhancing the ways we will share information.

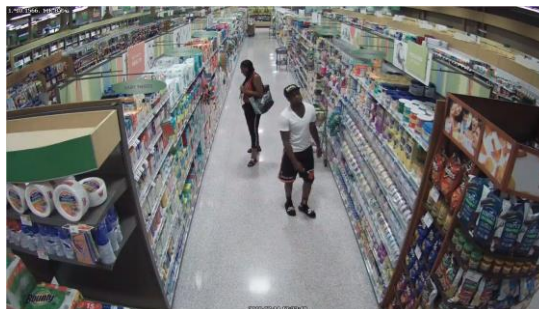

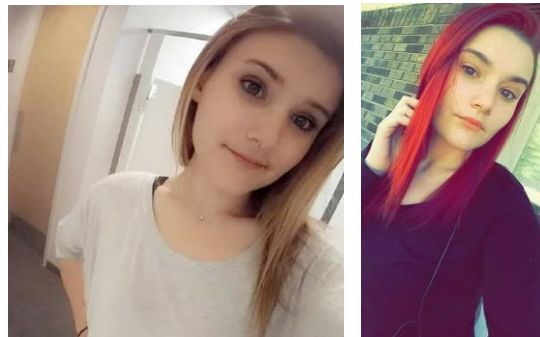

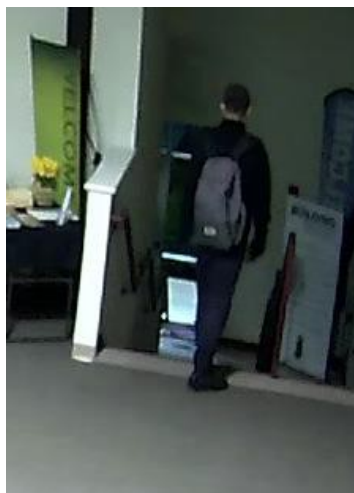

Traffic Advisory for NASCAR Races

Traffic patterns will temporarily be altered on roads around Richmond Raceway on Friday, September 21 and Saturday, September 22, 2018, to accommodate fans attending the NASCAR races.

Motorists are advised to expect heavy traffic and delays in the area on both days, especially on Saturday before and after the race from 8:00 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. and from 9:30 p.m. to 2:00 a.m.

Henrico Police officers will direct motorists before and after the races. Race fans and other motorists are encouraged to check traffic updates on message boards along interstates and other roads approaching the raceway. WRVA-1140 AM will broadcast traffic reports. Updates will also be posted on the Police Division's Twitter account @henricopolice and Henrico Police Facebook site.

The following traffic patterns will be in effect Saturday, September 22 during peak hours:

- Carolina Avenue between Laburnum and Azalea avenues will be one-way outbound after the race. Access to businesses along Carolina Avenue will be maintained from Laburnum Avenue.
- Richmond-Henrico Turnpike/Meadowbridge Road from the Henrico/Hanover county line to Azalea Avenue will be one-way southbound from about 1:00 p.m., until the race starts. Sections of Meadowbridge Road farther north in Hanover County will continue to accommodate two-way northbound and southbound traffic at all times.
- After the race, Laburnum Avenue from Carolina Avenue to Mechanicsville Turnpike will be one-way eastbound. Eastbound Laburnum Avenue from Richmond-Henrico Turnpike/Meadowbridge Road to Carolina Avenue will be closed until race traffic disperses. Two-way traffic will be maintained on Laburnum Avenue west of Richmond-Henrico Turnpike/Meadowbridge Road.
- After the race, beginning at approximately 10:00 p.m., Richmond-Henrico Turnpike/Meadowbridge Road north of Azalea Avenue will be one-way northbound to Atlee Road in Hanover County. Richmond-Henrico Turnpike/Meadowbridge Road will be restored to two-way traffic when race traffic disperses.

On **Saturday, October 6, from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.**, the two departments will conduct a document shredding and electronics recycling event. This will take place at **1400 Best Plaza Drive** (Off East Parham Road – one block east of I-95)

Citizens will be able to have personal documents securely shredded for free on site by Gone4Good. Additionally, citizens will be able to responsibly dispose of unwanted electronics by recycling them. Computer systems and accessories, printers, scanners, copiers, FAX machines, VCRs, camcorders, stereos, microwave ovens and other electronic items may be recycled free.

There is a fee to recycle old televisions. \$23 for TVs smaller than 27" and \$30 for TVs larger than 30".

Citizens may bring up to two boxes (10"x13"x18") or three paper grocery bags of personal documents only. No recyclable paper items will be accepted for shredding. The electronics recycling does not accept compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs), refrigerators, dehumidifiers, or air conditioners.

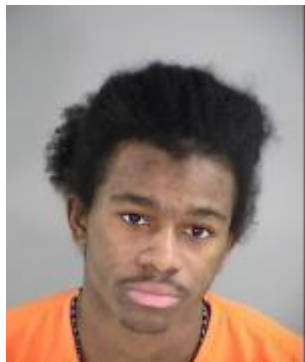

The Henrico County Police Division along with the U. S. Drug Enforcement Administration will participate in the nationwide Prescription Drug Take Back Program. This will take place on **Saturday, October 27, 2018 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.** at four locations in Henrico County.

- **Henrico Training Center, 7701 E. Parham Road** (access from Shrader Road).
- **Varina Public Library, 1875 New Market Road**
- **Eastern Henrico Recreation Center, 1440 N. Laburnum Avenue**
- **Wegmans – Short Pump, 12200 Wegmans Boulevard**

The program is free and anonymous. Unused or expired pills and patches will be accepted. Liquids, needles and sharp items will **not** be accepted. No questions will be asked.

Last April, Americans turned in 474.5 tons (949,046 pounds) of prescription drugs at more than 5,800 sites operated by the DEA and over 4,600 of its state and local law enforcement partners.

This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. In addition, Americans are now advised that their usual methods for disposing of unused medicines—flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash—pose potential safety and health hazards.

Henrico Police Issues a Scam Alert

Henrico Police is making the public aware of a scam targeting local businesses.

Henrico Police has been made aware of a scam being perpetrated by a fraudulent company offering advertising services to local businesses. The victim business receives an unsolicited telephone call from a person representing the company as an associate of a local high school booster club. The company offers banner space, T-shirts, and other sporting event promotional items to the business and suggests that a portion of the proceeds will go to support school athletics. If purchased, the company says they will send the promotional items to the local high school to be displayed or given away at sporting events.

The scam starts with the use of telemarketing and progresses to e-mail correspondence. A series of official-looking documents and detailed correspondences are sent to the victim business. Once payment is received, a small sample of inferior products is shipped, but the complete order is never delivered. This fraudulent promotion is not associated with any Henrico County school. The high schools do not receive any monetary proceeds that the fraudulent company promises will be donated to the school.

To avoid being a victim, businesses are encouraged not to participate in an unsolicited offer for advertisement benefitting school athletics without verifying its authenticity. If a business wishes to participate, it is recommended that someone contact a representative from the school to confirm the legitimacy of the promotion.

The program is free and anonymous. Unused or expired pills and patches will be accepted. Liquids, needles and sharp items will **not** be accepted. No questions will be asked.

Last October Americans turned in 456 tons (900,000 pounds) of prescription drugs at more than 5,300 sites operated by the DEA and over 4,200 of its state and local law enforcement partners.

This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. Traffic Advisory for NASCAR Races

Traffic patterns will temporarily be altered on roads around Richmond Raceway on Friday, April 20 and Saturday, April 21, 2018, to accommodate fans attending the NASCAR races.

Motorists are advised to expect heavy traffic and delays in the area on both days, especially on Saturday before and after the race from 8:00 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. and from 9:30 p.m. to 2:00 a.m.

Henrico Police officers will direct motorists before and after the races. Race fans and other motorists are encouraged to check traffic updates on message boards along interstates and other roads approaching the raceway. WRVA-1140 AM will broadcast traffic reports. Updates will also be posted on the Police Division's Twitter account @henricopolice and Henrico Police Facebook site.

The following traffic patterns will be in effect Saturday, April 21 during peak hours:

- Carolina Avenue between Laburnum and Azalea avenues will be one-way outbound after the race. Access to businesses along Carolina Avenue will be maintained from Laburnum Avenue.
- Richmond-Henrico Turnpike/Meadowbridge Road from the Henrico/Hanover county line to Azalea Avenue will be one-way southbound from about 1:00 p.m., until the race starts. Richmond Area Media Representatives:

In collaboration, the chief law enforcement officers of Chesterfield, Henrico, and Richmond write to inform you that our agencies will be encrypting police radio frequencies on July 2, 2018. Once this change occurs, law enforcement radio transmissions can only be monitored by authorized public safety personnel.

There are two reasons area law enforcement agencies are moving to encrypt their radio transmissions:

The first reason is to promote the safety of first responders and community members by ensuring that the dissemination of in-progress tactics and activities during high-risk events is limited to those whose mission is to resolve events swiftly and with minimal risk to those involved. The second reason is to ensure that sensitive personal information being communicated to resolve an event does not violate legal rights or reasonable expectations of privacy.

We are mindful of the impact that police radio encryption may have on our media partners. In response, we have tasked our staffs with developing alternative ways of keeping you informed of active, real-time information. Though each agency's approach may vary somewhat, the objective of each is to work with and support you as you fulfill your mission.

In the near future our public information officers will be communicating with you about how our respective agencies will be enhancing the ways we will share information.

Traffic Advisory for NASCAR Races

Traffic patterns will temporarily be altered on roads around Richmond Raceway on Friday, September 21 and Saturday, September 22, 2018, to accommodate fans attending the NASCAR races.

Motorists are advised to expect heavy traffic and delays in the area on both days, especially on Saturday before and after the race from 8:00 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. and from 9:30 p.m. to 2:00 a.m.

Henrico Police officers will direct motorists before and after the races. Race fans and other motorists are encouraged to check traffic updates on message boards along interstates and other roads approaching the raceway. WRVA-1140 AM will broadcast traffic reports. Updates will also be posted on the Police Division's Twitter account @henricopolice and Henrico Police Facebook site.

The following traffic patterns will be in effect Saturday, September 22 during peak hours:

- Carolina Avenue between Laburnum and Azalea avenues will be one-way outbound after the race. Access to businesses along Carolina Avenue will be maintained from Laburnum Avenue.
- Richmond-Henrico Turnpike/Meadowbridge Road from the Henrico/Hanover county line to Azalea Avenue will be one-way southbound from about 1:00 p.m., until the race starts. Sections of Meadowbridge Road farther north in Hanover County will continue to accommodate two-way northbound and southbound traffic at all times.
- After the race, Laburnum Avenue from Carolina Avenue to Mechanicsville Turnpike will be one-way eastbound. Eastbound Laburnum Avenue from Richmond-Henrico Turnpike/Meadowbridge Road to Carolina Avenue will be closed until race traffic disperses. Two-way traffic will be maintained on Laburnum Avenue west of Richmond-Henrico Turnpike/Meadowbridge Road.
- After the race, beginning at approximately 10:00 p.m., Richmond-Henrico Turnpike/Meadowbridge Road north of Azalea Avenue will be one-way northbound to Atlee Road in Hanover County. Richmond-Henrico Turnpike/Meadowbridge Road will be restored to two-way traffic when race traffic disperses.

- After the race, three lanes of Azalea Avenue from Richmond-Henrico Turnpike/Meadowbridge Road to Henrico High School will be routed westbound; one lane will be routed eastbound. This change will require all median crossovers on Azalea Avenue from Richmond-Henrico Turnpike/Meadowbridge Road to Henrico High School to be closed from about 10:00 p.m. until race traffic disperses. Police will assist motorists turning from Azalea Avenue onto Thrush Lane and Pony Farm Drive.

Parking:

- On-street parking on major routes to the raceway will be prohibited each day.
- There are no changes to general parking from last year's races.
- The quickest and easiest way to access FREE parking at Richmond Raceway on Saturday at **any time** is through Meadowbridge Road. While there are several free parking areas near the raceway, Lot H has the easiest access from/to the interstate. There is a FREE tram service from Lot H to the backstretch that runs continually starting at 7:00 a.m. through post-race.
- There is no longer a shuttle service from downtown. However, there are over 800 acres of free parking on site.
- Lyft and Uber will enter Gate 4, pick-up/drop-off, and exit Gate 5.
- Please note Gate 6 on Carolina Avenue and Gate 2 on Laburnum Avenue are designated as permit-only entry gates. If you do not have a permit, you will need to access Lot D via Gate 4 for FREE parking (first come, first serve).
- There is no public parking in Gate 10.

The Henrico County Police Division and the Henrico County Division of Solid Waste and Recycling are collaborating to help citizens responsibly recycle electronic items and prevent identity theft - all at the same time!

On **Saturday, October 6, from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.**, the two departments will conduct a document shredding and electronics recycling event. This will take place at **1400 Best Plaza Drive** (Off East Parham Road – one block east of I-95)

Citizens will be able to have personal documents securely shredded for free on site by Gone4Good. Additionally, citizens will be able to responsibly dispose of unwanted electronics by recycling them. Computer systems and accessories, printers, scanners, copiers, FAX machines, VCRs, camcorders, stereos, microwave ovens and other electronic items may be recycled free.

There is a fee to recycle old televisions. \$23 for TVs smaller than 27" and \$30 for TVs larger than 30".

Citizens may bring up to two boxes (10"x13"x18") or three paper grocery bags of personal documents only. No recyclable paper items will be accepted for shredding. The electronics recycling does not accept compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs), refrigerators, dehumidifiers, or air conditioners.

The Henrico County Police Division along with the U. S. Drug Enforcement Administration will participate in the nationwide Prescription Drug Take Back Program. This will take place on **Saturday, October 27, 2018 from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.** at four locations in Henrico County.

- **Henrico Training Center, 7701 E. Parham Road** (access from Shrader Road).
- **Varina Public Library, 1875 New Market Road**
- **Eastern Henrico Recreation Center, 1440 N. Laburnum Avenue**
- **Wegmans – Short Pump, 12200 Wegmans Boulevard**

The program is free and anonymous. Unused or expired pills and patches will be accepted. Liquids, needles and sharp items will **not** be accepted. No questions will be asked.

Last April, Americans turned in 474.5 tons (949,046 pounds) of prescription drugs at more than 5,800 sites operated by the DEA and over 4,600 of its state and local law enforcement partners.

This initiative addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Medicines that languish in home cabinets are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are alarmingly high, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinet. In addition, Americans are now advised that their usual methods for disposing of unused medicines—flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash—pose potential safety and health hazards.
